
Updates to SPFC Reference Documents



SPFC Reference Documents


State Plan of Flood Control (SPFC) Descriptive Document, 2010

Provides detailed inventory / description of structures included in the SPFC




Flood Control System Status Report (FCSSR), 2011

Describes physical condition of SPFC facilities




2016 Update to SPFC Descriptive Document

- Updates 2010 SPFC Descriptive Document
- Includes the following additional projects:
 - West Levee Yolo Bypass (Mellin Levee)
 - Lower Feather River Setback Levee at Star Bend
 - Natomas Cross Canal South Levee Project



2016 Update to Flood System Status Report

- Updates 2011 Flood Control System Status Report
- Includes refined physical conditions baseline for levee, channel, and flood control structures
- Provides documentation of CVFPP implementation progress




2017 ROADMAP




Sacramento River Basin-Wide Feasibility Study

- Evaluates options for improving the bypass system
- Stakeholder draft released April 1
- Stakeholder comment period ended in May 2016; DWR addressed stakeholders comments accordingly
- Revised draft released Nov. 14
- Version will be used to support the Draft 2017 CVFPP Update




San Joaquin River Basin-Wide Feasibility Study

- Refines the large-scale actions consistent with the State Systemwide Investment Approach
- Stakeholder draft released Oct. 14 for review
- Comments must be submitted by Nov. 23, via email to Sami.Nall@water.ca.gov



Conservation Strategy

- Provides comprehensive, long-term approach to improving riverine habitat and floodplains
- Outlines how to improve ecosystems beyond mitigation and contribute to recovery of species
- Revised draft anticipated to be released later this month
