18887-1	City of Davis	The project site is located along the existing Willow Slough Bypass Levee (County Road 28H), between County Road 105 and just past the east end of the existing Davis WWTP facility at 45400 County Road 28H in Davis.	Yolo	Willow Slough Bypass	This is a revision to Permit No. 18887 that authorized the widening of the Willow Slough Bypass Levee from Road 105 to the eastern edge of the City of Davis Wastewater Treatment Plant, to remove existing gates and signs and reinstall new ones, to construct a paved and gravel roadway, to reconstruct paved driveways off the levee, and to construct two "spurs" which will connect to a non-jurisdictional berm or flood wall that will extend around the plant. Condition No. TWENTY-ONE has been removed to allow the existing 24-inch diameter asbestos cement pipeline to be abandoned in place and filled with concrete.	Sacramento Maintenance Yard	An Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) (SCH Number: 2013052032, May 2013) was prepared pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) by the City of Davis acting as lead agency. The CVFPB considered and adopted responsible agency findings on November 8, 2013. The Board staff has determined that the Board's prior CEQA findings regarding the project are still valid and no new environmental effects could occur, and that no new mitigation measures are required as a result of this pipe feature. Therefore, no new environmental documents are required pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15164(b) [CEQA Guidelines Section 15164(b); Public Resources Code § 21166].

Merced	Eastside Bypass and Mariposa Bypass	To install five (5) power poles and extend an overhead utility line across the right (east) levee of the Eastside Bypass, the Eastside Bypass, the Mariposa Bypass, and the left (south) levee of the Mariposa Bypass.	N/A	The Board determined that the project is categorically exempt from CEQA under a Class 3 Categorical Exemption (CEQA Guidelines Section 15303) covering construction of small facilities.

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
