A. Permit No. 18609, San Joaquin County Resource Conservation District (Sam Brandon)

Consider approval of Permit No.18609 to approve removal of non-native vegetation and plant 200 elderberry plants and associated riparian plants on 20-acres within the Mokelumne River Designated Floodway on the right bank of the Mokelumne River. (San Joaquin County)

B. Permit Application No. 18648-1, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (Gary Lemon)

Consider approval of Permit No. 18648-1 to reconstruct a portion of the Palermo to East Nicolaus 115kV transmission line inside the Honcut Creek Floodway; remove existing towers; and authorize aerial crossings over the left (south) bank levee of Honcut Creek and east levee of Jack Slough. (Yuba County)

C. Permit Application No. 18648-2, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (Gary Lemon)
