Maintenance Area 1	Board staff has prepared the following California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) determination: The Board, as a Responsible Agency under CEQA, has reviewed the Initial Study, Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) (SCH No. 2012122063, December 2012) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) for the Colusa Boat Launching Facility Project, prepared by the lead agency, the City of Colusa (the City). The documents are also available for review in hard copy at the Board and the City offices. The City determined that the project would not have a significant effect on the environment on February 5, 2013, and subsequently filed a Notice of Determination on February 8, 2013 with the State Clearinghouse and Colusa County Clerk. Board staff finds the proposed project will not have a potentially significant effect on the environment because the City, as lead agency, has required mandatory mitigation measures that will mitigate all potentially significant impacts to less than significant. These mandatory mitigation measures have been incorporated into the project plans to avoid identified impacts or to mitigate such impacts to a point where no significant impacts will occur. These mitigation measures are included in the project proponent's MMRP and address impacts to air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, and hydrology.
