Work consists of: removing the boarding float sections and float piles, removing a portion of the concrete boat ramp, removing existing riprap, installing a new reinforced v-groove concrete boat ramp with concrete block mat and riprap, installing new boarding float with 12-inch diameter steel piles, installing concrete walkway, installing lighting and appurtenances, and expanding the existing parking area to add more parking spaces and to install a restroom with associated water and sewer utilities.	N/A	The Board, as a responsible agency under CEQA, has reviewed the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) (SCH Number: 2016031065, March 2016) and Mitigation Measures for the construction and operation of the improvements to the Cricket Hollow Boat Launch Facility, prepared by the lead agency, the City of Reedley. These documents are available for review from the City of Reedley, Community Development Department. The City of Reedley determined that the project would not have a significant effect on the environment and filed a Notice of Determination on May 2, 2016 with the Fresno County Clerk and the State Clearinghouse. Board staff finds that although the proposed project could have a potentially significant effect on the environment, there will not be a significant effect in this case because revisions in the project have been made by or agreed to by the project proponent. The project proponent has incorporated mandatory mitigation measures into the project plans to avoid identified impacts or to mitigate such impacts to a point where no significant impacts will occur. These mitigation measures are included in the project proponent's IS/MND and address impacts to biological resources, cultural resources and hydrology. The description of the mitigation measures are further described in the adopted Mitigation Monitoring Plan.
