N/A	<p>The Board, as a responsible agency under CEQA, has reviewed the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) (SCH No. 2014072008, August 2014) for the Red Bluff Riverfront Park Boat Launching Facility, prepared by the lead agency City of Red Bluff. These documents including project design are available for review in hard copy at Board and City offices.</p> <p>The City of Red Bluff determined that the project would not have a significant effect on the environment on August 19, 2014, and filed Notice of Determinations on August 28, 2014, with the County Clerk and the State Clearinghouse. Board staff finds that although the proposed project could have a potentially significant effect on the environment, there will not be a significant effect in this case because revisions in the project have been made by or agreed to by the project proponent. The project proponent has incorporated mandatory mitigation measures into the project plans to avoid identified impacts or to mitigate such impacts to a point where no significant impacts will occur. These mitigation measures are included in the project proponent's IS/MND and address impacts to aesthetics, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, geology, and hydrology and water quality, the description of the mitigation measures are further described in the adopted IS/MND.</p> <p>The documents and other materials which constitute the record of the Board's proceedings in this matter are in the custody of the Executive Officer, Central Valley Flood Protection Board, 3310 El Camino Avenue, Suite 170, Sacramento, California 95821.</p>
