Sacramento	Sacramento River	To install a self cleaning fish screen, a maintenance structure and walkway, part of the Sherman and Twitchell Island Fish Screen Project. This location will have the ability to retrieve the fishscreen using a track and electric winch powered by a portable generator. The structure will be supported on a pile foundation.	Reclamation District 341	The Board, as a responsible agency under CEQA, has reviewed the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) (SCH Number: 2016032007, March 2016) and Mitigation Measures for the Sherman and Twitchell Islands Fish Screen Project prepared by the Department of Water Resources as the lead agency. These documents including project design may be viewed at the Board and Department of Water Resources offices. The Department of Water Resources determined that the project would not have a significant effect on the environment and filed a Notice of Determination on April 15, 2016 with the State Clearinghouse. Staff finds that although the proposed project could have a potentially significant effect on the environment, there will not be a significant effect in this case because revisions in the project have been made by or agreed to by the project proponent. The project proponent has incorporated mandatory mitigation measures into the project plans to avoid identified impacts or to mitigate such impacts to a point where no significant impacts will occur. These mitigation measures are included in the project proponent's IS/MND and address impacts to biological resources, cultural resources, hazards and hazardous materials. The description of the mitigation measures are further described in the adopted IS/MND.
