Consider approval of Permit No. 18956-4 to construct a new two track precast railroad bridge track, approximately 670 feet long and 44 feet wide, and to add/remove a temporary trestle to facilitate construction of the permanent precast bridge over the Dutch John Cut, a distributary channel of the Kings River. The proposed bridge is a component of Construction Package 2-3 of the California High Speed Rail Project, which consists of 65.5 miles of track along an alignment from Fresno County to 1 mile north of Tulare/Kern County line. The project site is approximately 0.21 miles northwest of the intersection of 9th Avenue and Corona Avenue in Laton, California. (Kings County)

B. <u>Permit No. 19469 Turlock Irrigation District (TID) (Mauricio Meza, Operations Branch, Board Staff)</u>

Consider approval of Permit No. 19469 to construct an approximately 10-foot by 33-foot by 10-foot fish barrier structure with an elevated walkway and railing on the right (east) bank of the San Joaquin River. The proposed project is located approximately 3.25 miles southeast of the Crows Landing Bridge, near the Stanislaus and Merced County line. (Merced County)

C. <u>Permit No. 19480, Quinley Avenue Bridge Replacement Project</u> (Nate Kibret, Operations Branch, Board Staff)

Consider approval of Permit No. 19480 to remove and replace the existing Quinley Avenue Bridge over Black Rascal Creek with a 3-span cast-in-place reinforced concrete slab bridge. The project is located approximately 0.55 miles south of the intersection of CA State Highway 140 (McSwain Road) and Quinley Avenue, west of the City of Merced. (Merced County).

D. <u>Permit No. 19573 Union Pacific Railroad Bridge Replacement</u> (*Humberto Negrete, Operations Branch, Board Staff*)

Consider approval of Permit No. 19573 to replace the existing single-track, 8-span, 120-foot-long, timber stringer trestle ballast deck bridge with a single-track, 5-span, 150-foot-long bridge. Rock slope protection will be placed at the new bridge abutments for erosion control. A temporary in-water trestle will be used for bridge removal and construction. Temporary fill will be placed for site access and staging. The project is located where the existing Union Pacific Railroad Valley Subdivision rail line crosses Reeds Creek at Mile Post (MP) 135.11, approximately 2 miles southeast of the City of Olivehurst. (Yuba County)
