Consider adoption of Resolution 2021-06 to approve Permit No. 19477 to construct approximately 2.9 miles of a new setback levee along Duck Slough and Liberty Island Road. The existing Yolo Bypass levee will be breached at Shag Slough and partially degraded to provide tidal and flood connectivity between Shag Slough and with the Lookout Slough Project site. The existing Cache/Hass Slough levee will be improved to increase stability and reduce long-term maintenance cost. Grading, placement of fill material, and re-vegetation would restore and enhance approximately 3,164 acres of upland, tidal, and floodplain habitat. The Project is located within the legal Delta in the Lower Yolo Bypass, west of Liberty Island and northeast of Cache Slough (Solano County).
