D. <u>Permit 18365-1 Wineland Scot N Revocable Inter Vivos Trust</u> (*Humberto Negrete, Operations Branch, Board Staff*)

Approve permit 18365-1 to construct a 46-foot by 66-foot addition to an existing 46-foot by 66-foot metal storage building authorized by Permit No. 18365. The addition will utilize a prefabricated metal building on concrete perimeter and spread footings with a concrete slab-on-grade. The project is located at 9009 River Road in the City of Chico, within Area B of the Butte Basin. (Butte County)

E. Permit No. 19562 Reclamation District 1001 (Deb Biswas, Operations Branch, Board Staff)

Approve Permit No. 19562 to construct a new fuel-powered auxiliary drainage pump station located on the landside toe of the Natomas Cross Canal (NCC) North Levee, at the south end of the Reclamation District 1001 "Lateral No. 4 Channel". The pump station will consist of a steel frame structure with a concrete mattress foundation along with two vertical turbine pumps, two propane power units, and associated appurtenances. The project will also involve: 1) construction of two landside ramps and one waterside ramp; 2) construction of two 36-inch drainage discharge pipes through the NCC North Levee; and 3) grading of an irrigation ditch. The proposed project is located about 2.50 miles west of the El Centro Boulevard (State Highway 99) and about 2.48 miles south of the West Catlett Road (Sutter County).

F. <u>Permit No. 19718 Department of Water Resources</u> (Jacqueline Hoang, Operations Branch, Board Staff)

Approve Permit No. 19718 to install approximately fifty-six (56) 20-feet long by 3-feet wide Alaskan-style resistance board weir panels with seventeen (17) 10-feet wide substrate rails anchored to the streambed, fish trap, Passive Integrated Transponder antenna array, camera system, and warning signs. All systems will be powered by a fenced solar panel array and appurtenances that will be installed onsite. The project is in and adjacent to the low-flow channel (LFC) of the Feather River, approximately 1.6 miles upstream of the Thermalito Afterbay Outlet, southwest of the town of Oroville, CA (Butte County).
