1. WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Bill Edgar, Board President, welcomed the participants.

Ms. Leslie Gallagher, Board Executive Officer, congratulated Mr. Eric Koch upon his appointment of Chief, DWR Division of Flood Management.

Executive Officer Gallagher also introduced Ms. Itzia Rivera, a new Board Senior Environmental Scientist. Ms. Rivera takes over the position recently vacated by Ms. Andrea Buckley, who was elevated to Branch Chief.

2. ROLL CALL/ESTABLISH A QUORUM (Water Code § 8560)

Ms. Kathryn Baines, Board Analyst, called the roll and a quorum was achieved.

7. DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES (DWR) ITEMS (Information)

A. Monthly Report of the Department of Water Resources

DWR Project Updates and Recent Events

Mr. Eric Koch, newly-announced DWR Division of Flood Management Division Chief, gave the report and answered Board Member questions.

He discussed recent flood and high water events, what the events mean to the overall system, and where the state is now in terms of hydrology.

The Draft 2017 Update of the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP) and Draft Supplemental Environmental documents were transmitted to the Board on December 30, 2016.

The Draft EIR on the Environmental Permit for Operation and Maintenance (EPOM) was released for public comment on January 18th. The public review period lasts 45 days and ends on March 3, 2017. EPOM is an environmental compliance and permitting effort that DWR's flood maintenance office is undertaking to obtain new State permits to continue our mandated maintenance responsibilities on the Sacramento Flood Control Project, specifically for DWR's O&M activities, per Water Codes 8361 and 12878. DWR's current permit, which is a California Department of Fish and Wildlife Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement, expires in January of 2018. A public meeting will be held February 22nd to solicit comments on the Draft EIR. More information about EPOM is on the DWR website.

DWR issued a flood alert on January 5th and, in response, the State-Federal Flood Operations Center was activated on Saturday, January 7th at 6:00 a.m. It remained active until January 14th at 6:00 a.m.

As a result of the high water events in the Central Valley and the concurrent and subsequent storms in Southern California and coastal areas, the Governor proclaimed a State of Emergency in 50 of the 58 counties in California. There have been several requests for technical and flood fight assistance; gates of the Sacramento Weir were opened for the first time since January 2006; flows over the Fremont, Colusa and Moulton Weirs. Board members asked questions and made comments regarding the San Joaquin Valley reservoirs and operation for flood space from snow melt.

Mr. Jon Moore, California Office of Emergency Services Assistant Director for Recovery, discussed some of the implications of the Governors' proclamation.

A primary intent of the proclamation is to allow Caltrans to formally request assistance through the Federal Highway Administration's Emergency Relief Program to repair the extensive road and highway damage from flooding.

In addition, the proclamation made assistance available through the California Disaster Assistance Act based on damage assessments received.

Finally, the proclamation orders state agencies to assist with activities related to recovery and response to the January storms.

Mr. Boone Lek, DWR Hydrology and Flood Operations Office, updated the Board on changes in water levels and the snowpack as a result of the January events.

B. 2017 Update to the 2012 Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP)

Overview of the Draft 2017 CVFPP Update

Ms. Mary Jimenez, DWR Flood Planning Branch Chief, discussed the draft update and presented a Power Point. The draft 2017 update was publicly released at the end of December. Ms. Jimenez highlighted the contents of the Plan, a comparison to the Plan adopted in 2012, and discussed how the two documents are really meant to go together.

Board Members commented on the 2017 update and Ms. Jimenez answered their questions.

C. Annual DWR Inspection Briefing

Mr. Wade Wylie, Section Chief with DW's Flood Project Integrity and Inspections Branch, provided the briefing and answered Board Member questions. The briefing included the 2016 Local Maintenance Agency (LMA) Report, LMA summary profiles, and the US Army Corps of Engineers inspection ratings. He also reported 2016 branch achievements and the continuing outreach efforts to the various LMA's. Ms. Nekani Hollister, DWR Flood Project Inspection Section, discussed the LMA Reporting program overall, including background, program activities and results, observed trends, and future plans.

The Investment Strategy Technical Memorandum is expected to be released the end of February and it will be added to the website at that time. Information on how public comments may be submitted is also on the website.
