Applicant: Jason Kuechler

Location Description: The project is located approximately 197 feet north of the Riverlake Way and Ironwood Way Intersection and across the left bank levee of the Sacramento River downstream from the Brickyard.

County: Sacramento

Stream: Sacramento River

Project Description: This is a “name change” permit only that includes conditions that are consistent with current flood control standards and policies of the Central Valley Flood Protection Board. This permit supersedes Permit No. 12393-A GM that was issued to Daphne H. and Robert E. Schaffer on August 21, 1979 and Permit No. 12393 GM (Revised-A) that was issued to Robert James and Denise Bizeau Gomez on April 11, 2000. This name change permit only authorizes the existing retaining wall, wrought iron fence, and pool deck included in Permit No. 12393-A GM or Permit No. 12393 GM (Revised-A). This name change permit does not authorize a cross levee fence, redwood steps, three lemon trees, two oak trees, or landscaping that were previously permitted encroachments, but no longer exist or were removed as part of the American River Common Features 2016 (ARCF-16) project.

LMA Endorsement: Maintenance Area 9

CEQA Finding: The Board has determined that an application to change the name of the permittee does not have the potential to result in either a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, and thus, is not a “project” for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA Public Resources Code Section 21065; CEQA California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 14, Section 15378(a)).

Applicant: Frank Carson

Location Description: The project is located on the left (east) bank levee of the Sacramento River at 6057 Garden Highway, approximately 0.4 miles south of the intersection of Garden Highway and Elkhorn Boulevard

County: Sacramento

Stream: Sacramento River

Project Description: To remove the existing elevated walkway, deck and gangway leading from the second story of the residence to the floating dock; and install a new 20-foot by 10-foot concrete dead

man with 70-foot long gangway to relocate the existing floating boat dock. An existing spiral stair case will also be relocated to the side of the residence.

LMA Endorsement: Reclamation District 1000

CEQA Finding: The Board has determined the project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 2, Replacement and Reconstruction and Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land categorical exemptions (CEQA CCR, Title 14, Sections 15302 and 15304), because the removal and replacement of the spiral staircase, deadman, and gangway and the relocation of the floating boat dock has the same purpose and a smaller capacity as the original features and will be located on the same project site. This private alteration will not result in the removal of healthy, mature, or scenic trees. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.

Location Description: The project is located approximately 2 miles south of the community of Courtland, approximately 263 feet downstream from the junction with Steamboat Slough.

County: Sacramento

Stream: Sacramento River

Project Description: To install a 60-foot by 29-foot private boat dock which includes: a 40-foot by 25-foot covered boat slip canopy; 15-foot by 40-foot boat slip; 20-foot by 29-foot angular dock landing bench; and a 60-foot by 4-foot aluminum gangway anchored by a concrete landing on the levee hinge. The dock will include a debris diverter, consisting of five 16-inch diameter steel piling anchoring a 52-foot floating pair of steel pontoons.

LMA Endorsement: Reclamation District 3

CEQA Finding: The Board has determined the project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 3, New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures categorical exemption (CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15303) because the proposed activity consists of the installation of a private boat dock, an aluminum gangway supported by a concrete landing, and a debris diverter. The project is also exempt under the Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land categorical exemption (CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15304) because the proposed activity consists of the construction of the concrete landing pad on the edge of the levee crown and does not involve the removal healthy, mature, scenic trees. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.

Location Description: The project is located at left bank levee at 4007 Garden Hwy., Sacramento, CA 95834

County: Sacramento

Stream: Sacramento River

Project Description: To install a private boat dock with cover, gangway and landing to provide recreational access to the river. The proposed dock (W-shape, 32'x36', (2) fingers at 3'x24', (1) finger at 6'x24'), head float at 8'x40' and gangway (3'x70' aluminum) will be manufactured off-site and

delivered to the nearest boat ramp. Installation of the dock will require pile driving of four (4) 12" steel piles with a barge-mounted pile driver, anchoring a 52-foot floating pair of steel pontoons.

LMA Endorsement: Reclamation District 1000

CEQA Finding: The Board has determined the project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 3, New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures categorical exemption (CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15303) because the proposed activity consists of the construction of a private boat dock with cover, gangway, and landing. The project is also exempt under the Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land categorical exemption (CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15304) because the proposed activity consists of the minor private alterations in the condition of the land and vegetation that does not involve the removal healthy, mature, scenic trees. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.

Applicant: Rainbow Orchards X, LLC

Location Description: on the left bank of the Feather River, along Garden Hwy, approximately 5.13 miles downstream of the Highway 99 bridge crossing Feather River in Nicolaus, California

County: Sutter

Stream: Feather River

Project Description: This is a "name change" permit only and includes conditions that are consistent with current flood control standards and policies of the Central Valley Flood Protection Board. This permit supplements and where in conflict supersedes the conditions in Permit No. 2931-1 that was issued to Scheiber Holden Rev 15 TR ET on November 16, 2021 to authorize an existing bypass intake assembly consisting of a submersible back up pump on an existing platform that is tied into an existing pump station. This permit supplements and where in conflict supersedes the conditions in Permit No. 2931 issued to Mrs. Aileen Marty on October 15, 1958 to install an 18-inch mixed flow, inclined pump with 50 horse power electric motor

LMA Endorsement: Reclamation District 1001

CEQA Finding: The Board has determined that an application to change the name of the permittee does not have the potential to result in either a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, and thus, is not a "project" for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA Public Resources Code Section 21065; CEQA CCR, Title 14, 15378(a)).

Application Number: 19770

Applicant: Pacific Gas & Electric Company

Location Description: The poles are located at the right bank along the Feather River, landside toe of the levee, between Twin Cities Memorial Bridge (aka 5th Street Bridge) and Teegarden Avenue; approximately LM 13.80 to 13.90, in Sutter County

County: Sutter

Stream: Feather River

Project Description: To authorize five (5) existing PG&E power poles, along the landside levee toe of the Feather River in Levee District 1, Sutter County. Poles were identified in the USACE levee As-Built drawing No. 04-04-0172-1, August 1938, Sheet No. 172-1.

LMA Endorsement: Levee District 1 Sutter

CEQA Finding: The Board has determined that the project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 1, Existing Facilities categorical exemption (CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15301), because the activity consists of authorizing five existing power poles that were previously replaced under emergency work. No expansion of existing or former use will occur. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA CCR, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.
