1. ROLL CALL/ESTABLISH A QUORUM (Water Code § 8560)

Jonah Knapp, Board Clerk and Executive Assistant, called the roll and a quorum was established.

2. WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Jane Dolan, Board President, welcomed the participants.

Chris Lief, Board Executive Officer, announced that Detta Hunt is retiring in May. She has been with the Board since 2018 and has had a 30-year State career.

Mr. Lief introduced Aaron Bernachi, who joined the Board as a Water Resources Engineer in the Operations Branch Permitting Section.

3. REVIEW AGENDA

President Dolan briefly reviewed the agenda.

4. APPROVE MINUTES – March 28, 2025

Secretary Johnson moved that that the March 28, 2025 Minutes be approved with a correction to clarify that Item 9A was not an Action item, but rather was Informational.

Upon motion by Secretary Johnson, seconded by Board Member Griego, the Board unanimously approved, by a 5-0 vote, the March 28, 2025 Board Meeting Minutes with that correction (Absent-Villines, Bosler).

Upon **motion** by Board Member Griego, seconded by Board Member Andrews, the Board unanimously approved, by a 5-0 vote, Consent Items 5A, 5B, 5C and 5D (Absent-Villines, Bosler).

6. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Bill Brattain commented on his concerns regarding the USACE's Contract 3B. He suggested that the Board, as CEQA lead agency, should ask the various agencies involved to remove Contract 3B from the environmental document and reissue it with a reasonable range of alternatives, as required by CEQA, and include in that the promised bioengineering alternative.

Pete Spaulding and Brenda Gustin, American River Trees, stressed the need to ensure that sufficient time is taken to properly complete the Contract 3B process in a way that culminates with a win-win-win -- erosion control and flood protection that ensures a wild and scenic American River Parkway for generations to come.

7. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

A. A written update on pertinent State legislation and federal news will be provided.

President Dolan noted that the Board did receive the written update.

8. UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS (USACE)

A. Presentation of the USACE Levee Inspection Results for Feather River right bank – Sutter Bypass east bank, Sutter County.

Jeremiah Peek, Board Staff Engineer, Deferred Encroachment Compliance Section and Juan Gonzalez, USACE, gave the presentation and answered questions.

Mark List, DWR Supervising Engineering Geologist, and Kyle Sanchez, MHM and Levee Districts 1 (Sutter County) and 9, provided additional information.

9. BOARD ITEMS

A. Adopt Resolution 2025-01 for the adoption of the Charter for the Central Valley Flood Protection Board Advisory Committee on Implementation of Habitat-Related Issues Identified in the 2022 Update of the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan.

Jamie Silva, Board Senior Environmental Scientist, introduced the resolution.

Board Member Andrews and Secretary Johnson provided background on the Advisory Committee.

Upon motion by Board Member Andrews, seconded by Secretary Johnson, the Board unanimously adopted, by a 5-0 vote, Resolution 2025-01 (Absent-Villines, Bosler).

- B. Approve Permit No. 19914 for the construction of 1.6 miles of levee cutoff wall for the Tudor Flood Risk Reduction Project on the southern-most portion of the Feather River West Levee.
- C. Approve Permit No. 13624-1 for the removal and replacement of an existing 20-inch pressurized pipe due to the construction of a cutoff wall for the Tudor Flood Risk Reduction Project (Permit No. 19914).

Dustin Sanoski, Board Senior Engineer, Flood System Improvement Branch, introduced Items B and C (same project, different permits) and answered questions. He concluded his remarks with the staff recommendation that the Board adopt the CEQA findings (for both permits), conditionally approve the permits upon receipt of the Letters of Permission and direct the Executive Officer to execute the permits and file the Notices Of Determination with the State Clearinghouse.

Chris Fritz, R&F Engineering and Sutter Butte Flood Control Agency, commented that it is very exciting to reach this milestone on this important project.

Michael Wright, Board Chief Engineer, provided additional clarifying information.

Upon **motion** by Board Member Griego, seconded by Board Member Andrews, the Board unanimously approved Permits 19914 and 13624-1, by a 5-0 vote (Absent-Villines, Bosler).

D. Informational Briefing on the Sacramento Weir and Bypass Widening Project.

Selva Selvamohan, Board Sacramento Levees Section Manager; Adam Bier, USACE Engineering Technical Lead for the project; Cesar Medina, USACE Lead Project Engineer; and Kevin Fellows, HDR, provided the briefing and answered questions.

President Dolan noted that the written report was submitted.

B. Delta Levee Maintenance Subventions Program – Approve the FY 2023-24 Subventions Program AMENDMENT 2 Funding Allocation Plan.

Justin Logan, DWR Staff Engineer, provided a brief overview.

Upon motion by Board Member Griego, seconded by Board Member Andrews, the Board unanimously approved, by a 5-0 vote, the Funding Allocation Plan (Absent-Villines, Bosler).

C. Approve DWR Maintenance Area Budget for FY 2025-26.

Mark List, DWR Supervising Engineering Geologist, introduced the item.

Brain Murphy, DWR Senior Engineer Specialist, presented details of the actual budget and answered questions.

Upon motion by Board Member Andrews, seconded by Board Member Griego, the Board unanimously approved, by a 5-0 vote, the FY 2025-26 DWR Maintenance Area Budget to fix the amount of the estimate as presented, pursuant to California Water Code 12878, et seq (Absent-Villines, Bosler).
